RED ALE REELS CUSTOMERS IN DURING TAP TAKEOVER

Rhys, who started at the pub two years ago as a bar associate, organised the real-ale event with Whitewater Brewing Co - to bring a selection of its beers for customers to enjoy.

Rhys said: "During my promotion to shift leader, taking the online course at the turn of the year. I became interested in the real-ale side of things.

"I have been asking our real-ale-drinking customers what they would like to see on the bar and receiving ideas from them in our suggestions box."

Wetherspoon is proud to support local breweries across Ireland, sourcing locally produced beers for customers to enjoy.

The beer choice at Wetherspoon's pubs across Ireland is also more extensive and more local than ever before, with beers from The Porterhouse Brewing Company and Dungarvan Brewing Company being served.

In 2022, Wetherspoon teamed up with The Porterhouse Brewing Company, located in Glasnevin (Dublin), to offer a range of beers brewed in Ireland.

He continued: "Whitewater is based in Castlewellan, about 40 miles from the pub, and is well known locally, so I contacted the brewery to order a selection of ales for the event."

The tap takeover, which ran for two weeks, showcased six ales.

They were a formidable IPA Maggies Leap (4.7% ABV), Belfast Black (4.2% ABV) an Irish stout, a honey and ginger golden ale Bee's Endeavour (4.8% ABV), Hoppelhammer (6.0% ABV) a triple-hopped IPA, a rugged red ale Hen. Cock and Pigeon Rock (4.8% ABV) and Hallion Red (4.2% ABV) also a red ale.

Rhys reported: "The Hen, Cock and Pigeon Rock was definitely a favourite with customers."

The range includes Renegade New England IPA (5.3% ABV), Rambler Juicy Pale Ale (4.6% ABV), Nitro Red Irish Ale (4.2% ABV) and Session Pale Ale (4.2% ABV).

For real-ale enthusiasts at Wetherspoon's pubs across Ireland, there is a great range of cask beers to choose from - brewed right here in Ireland.

Among the guest ale listing at Wetherspoon is Copper Coast Irish red ale (4.3% ABV), brewed by Dungarvan Brewing Company which has been brewing in County Waterford since 2010. It is an easy-drinking, fruity Irish red ale with a hop bite and a definite caramel character.

WORD IS OUT ABOUT BILINGUAL SIGNS IN CELTIC NATIONS' PUBS



Wetherspoon's pubs in the Republic of Ireland celebrate the Irish language with Irish-language signage displayed in pubs across the country.

The signage throughout the pubs is bilingual, displaying both Irish and English, and indicates directions to various areas and facilities in each building.

Keavan's Port (Dublin) was chosen by Glór na nGael as the venue for filming a business video featuring some of the Irishlanguage signage on display.

Glór na nGael offers support, help and recognition to businesses which already use, or would like to incorporate, the Irish language as part of their business.

Glór na nGael's Frainc Mac Coinnaith said: "We are running a scheme to promote the use of the Irish language in business and were keen to speak to large companies with businesses in Ireland which are using the language, including Wetherspoon.

"We hope that these videos will encourage traders and groups to use more Irish on signs and in services.

"They will show that the approach taken by one business may work for other businesses and that good practice has already been laid down." Wetherspoon's area manager – Republic of Ireland, Dan Foster, pictured (right) with Frainc, was on hand to answer questions and explain Wetherspoon's decision to use bilingual signage in its pubs.

Dan said: "When Wetherspoon opens its pubs in towns and cities which also use a language other than English, it is important that the pubs recognise and respect the local community and its native-language-speaking residents.

"Wherever possible, the pubs will display bilingual signage, which can be seen in Wetherspoon's pubs across Ireland, Cornwall, Scotland and Wales.

This is an integral part of our commitment to the various communities where our pubs are located, while celebrating the traditions, history and diversity of the local area."

One Wetherspoon pub in the Republic of Ireland also has an Irish-language name.

An Geata Arundel (Waterford), meaning 'The Arundel Gate', takes its name from the nearby gate, long-since demolished, in Waterford's ancient city wall.

Purity Bunny Hop 3.4% ABV

Purity Brewery, Warwickshire. Est. 2005

This hazy, pale golden ale is extra hoppy in character, with a full aroma, pronounced bitterness in the flavour, notes of grapefruit and a long, dry finish.

Hops: Azacca, Centennial, Chinook, Citra, Eureka, Pilgrim

Rudgate Vanilla Mild 3.6% ABV Rudgate Brewery, North Yorkshire. Est. 1992

This multiaward-winning dark mild is very lightly hopped and enriched with fresh premium vanilla pods, resulting in a well-balanced, rich and smooth flavour.

Hops: East Kent Goldings

Acorn 2 Decades 4.0% ABV

Acorn Brewery, South Yorkshire. Est. 2003

Brewed with a blend of English hop varieties to celebrate 20 years' brewing, this blond beer has a tropical fruit aroma and a balanced, hoppy flavour.

Hops: Challenger, Goldings, Harlequin

Adnams Nut Brown 4.0% ABV Adnams Brewery, Suffolk. Est. 1872

This chestnut-coloured beer has aromas of gooseberry, pine, toasted malt and caramel, leading to hints of brown sugar on the palate, balanced by a fresh bitterness, with orange and fresh bread notes.

Hops: Ekuanot, Jester

Black Sheep Finisher 4.0% ABV

Black Sheep Brewery, North Yorkshire. Est. 1992

This seasonal golden pale ale is packed full of hops which deliver ripe apricot, juicy citrus and subtle spicy flavours, balanced by a light sweet maltiness.

Hops: Ernest

Brewster's Krafty Kiwi 4.0% ABV Brewster's Brewery, Lincolnshire. Est. 1998

This occasionally brewed, light golden beer contains hints of crystal malt, enhancing the flavour and balancing

the lemon zest notes and hints of pine, with a lasting resinous finish.

Hops: Pacific Gem. Pacific Jade

Steel & Oak Easy Stout 4.0% ABV Steel & Oak Brewing, British Columbia,

Canada. Est. 2014

Robyn Guille has travelled to Batemans Brewery (Lincolnshire) to brew this tropical session stout for us. The aromas of tropical and citrus fruit lead to a smooth roasted malt flavour, with notes of chocolate and toffee, then a full-bodied, creamy and refreshing finish.

Hops: Amarillo, El Dorado

Inveralmend Ossian Oatmeal Stout 4.1% ABV

Inveralmend Brewery, Perthshire, Est. 1997

This new beer is rich in flavour and packed full of coffee, cocoa and roasted malt flavours, complemented by bittersweet notes and balanced by a smooth, creamy finish.

Hops: Aurora

Hook Norton Autumn Ways 4.2% ABV Hook Norton Brewery, Oxfordshire. Est. 1849

This ruby-coloured seasonal ale has an inviting floral aroma, while its use of Maris Otter malt, plus a touch of rye and wheat, delivers complexity to the soft dark fruit flavour. Hops: Bramling Cross, Celeia, Fuggles, UK Cascade

Evan Evans Challenger 4.3% ABV

Evan Evans Brewery, Carmarthenshire. Est. 2004

This new deep amber autumn beer has a predominantly malty character, balanced by plenty of hop notes, delivering a smooth flavour and a fresh, crisp, spicy finish.

Hops: Challenger, Ernest, First Gold, Goldings

Maxim Slovenian Pale Ale 4.3% ABV

Maxim Brewery, County Durham. Est. 2007

This light golden seasonal ale is brewed with a blend of pale ale and lager malts to give a European character, while its Slovenian hops deliver a pleasing floral aroma and hints of lemon in the flavour.

Hops: Dana, Eureka, Styrian Wolf

Batemans Combined Harvest 4.4% ABV Batemans Brewery, Lincolnshire. Est. 1874

This deep golden seasonal beer contains a unique multigrain blend of malted barley, oats, wheat and rye, creating a refreshing flavour with a dry-sweet character, plus citrus hints.

Hons: Bohek

Castle Rock Phoenix Tears 4.5% ABV

Castle Rock Brewery, Nottinghamshire. Est. 1998 This new copper-coloured beer, using solely UK

ingredients, delivers a beautiful balance of hop notes and malt flavours, resulting in a bittersweet character and a warming, spicy finish.

Hops: Goldings, Phoenix

Harviestoun Broken Dial 4.5% ABV Harviestoun Brewery,

Clackmannanshire. Est. 1983

This amber seasonal ale has a distinctive malty flavour. with chocolate notes, balanced by a complex hop aroma and flavour, leading to a pleasing tropical fruit finish.

Hops: Celeia, Citra, Liberty, Simcoe

Robinsons Fear Of The Dark 4.5% ABV Robinsons Brewery, Cheshire. Est. 1838

This black stout, part of this brewer's popular Iron Maiden Trooper range, has a complex blend of roasted malt, chocolate and coffee flavours, balanced by peppery hop notes.

Hops: Goldings

St Austell Average Joe! 4.5% ABV St Austell Brewery, Cornwall. Est. 1851

This amber-coloured occasionally brewed beer has a vfruity aroma, leading to generous floral flavours and hints of blackcurrant, balanced by an emerging malty finish.

Hops: Bramling Cross, Fuggles, Harlequin

Zululand Zulu Blonde 4.5% ABV

Zululand Brewery, Eshowe, South Africa. Est. 1997

Richard Chennells has returned to brew this popular beer for us again, this time at Banks's Brewery (West Midlands). This golden amber beer has a predominantly malty character, balanced by fruit flavours and hints of citrus, leading to a light, crisp finish.

Hops: Fuggles, Goldings, Saaz

Conwy Kashmir IPA 4.8% ABV

Conwy Brewery, Conwy. Est. 2003

This golden seasonal beer is a traditional IPA, delivering an assertive bitterness and plenty of hop flavour, balanced by a subtle maltiness, and leading to a spicy, peppery finish.

Hops: Challenger, East Kent Goldings, Fuggles, Pioneer

Salopian The Murmurings of a Lost Leviathan 4.8% ABV

Salopian Brewery, Shropshire. Est. 1995

This golden IPA sparkles with mesmerising tangerine and papaya sorbet notes, delivering a hoppy and full (yet not overpowering) flavour which melds beautifully across a brazen sea of passion fruit and lemon zest.

Hops: Centennial, Challenger, Mosaic, Nelson Sauvin

Shepherd Neame Cracklewick 4.8% ABV Shepherd Neame Brewery, Kent. Est. 1698

This occasionally brewed mahogany ale has floral, citrus and spicy aromas, which complement the chocolate and roasted malt hints in its flavour, resulting in a satisfying, smooth and velvety character

Hops: Centennial, East Kent Goldings, First Gold

Yazoo Dos Perros 4.8% ABV

Yazoo Brewing, Tennessee, USA. Est. 2003

Linus Hall has travelled to Adnams Brewery (Suffolk) to brew this deep amber beer for us. The bready malt aroma leads to a malty body, with a clean, refreshing character and a subtle hop finish.

Hops: Perle, Saaz

Titanic Cherry Porter 4.9% ABV Titanic Brewery, Staffordshire. Est. 1985

This dark red speciality porter has a rich aroma and a well-rounded fruity character, with its sweet cherry flavour balanced by generous hop notes.

Hops: Celeia, Goldings, Herkules, Pilgrim

Fyne Ales Quiet Shadows 5.0% ABV Fyne Ales, Argyll. Est. 2001

This new hazy straw-coloured pale ale has a ripe fruit and resinous aroma, leading to delicate strawberry and raspberry flavours, complemented by vibrant citrus notes, before resulting in a soft, silky finish.

Hops: Barbe Rouge T90, Belma T90, Chinook T90, Simcoe

Hogs Back Ratfink & Ripsnorter 5.0% ABV

Hogs Back Brewery, Surrey. Est. 1992

This ruby beer has an enticing malty aroma, with gentle spice notes leading to a powerful malty flavour with hints of plum, balanced by generous refreshing hoppy notes.

Hops: Fuggles, Goldings

Joe's Garage Bohemian Pale Ale 5.0% ABV Joe's Garage Brewery, Plzeň,

Czech Republic. Est. 2005

Josef and Petr Krýsl have travelled to Shepherd Neame Brewery (Kent) to brew this pale amber beer for us. The use of rare Czech hop varieties delivers aromatic citrus and spicy notes, along with a balanced bitterness to its full-bodied, malty flavour.

Hops: Kazbek

Thornbridge Hubble 5.2% ABV Thornbridge Brewery, Derbyshire. Est. 2005

This golden American pale ale is packed with a mouthwatering blend of US hops, delivering big punchy notes of mango, lemon and orange from the aroma all the way through to its refreshing finish.

Mitch Steele has travelled to Hook Norton Brewery (Oxfordshire) to brew this deep golden beer for us. The intensely fruity aroma leads to a medium body and emerging hop character, with plenty of tropical fruit notes and a pleasing bitterness in the finish

Hops: Azacca, Citra, Mosaic

Wychwood King Goblin 6.6% ABV Wychwood Brewery, Oxfordshire. Est. 1983

This rarely seen, deep ruby strong ale is brewed with roasted chocolate and crystal malts which, combined with a blend of hop varieties, produce a rich and full-bodied beer, with fruity notes and a pleasingly smooth character.

Hops: Cascade, Fuggles, Sovereign, Styrian

Available on draught, Strongbow Dark Fruit has a flavour which is perfectly balanced between the sweetness of the fruit and the cider apples' sharpness.

Strongbow cider is made using a blend of bittersweet cider apples grown and pressed in the Herefordshire countryside, for a thirst-quenching taste.

Range

These two choices join Kopparberg Strawberry & Lime (4.0% ABV) and Thatchers Gold (4.8% ABV), in Wetherspoon's draught cider range.

Wetherspoon's 500ml bottle range has a great selection of cider choices.

Thatchers Blood Orange (4.0% ABV) and Bulmers Original (4.5% ABV) are available, alongside Kopparberg's cider varieties – Passionfruit, Strawberry & Lime, Mixed Fruit (4.0% ABV each) and NEW Sweet Vintage Pear (7.0% ABV).

Vintage

Kopparberg Sweet Vintage Pear is the latest cider from the Kopparberg bottled range to join Wetherspoon's ranks.

In 1882, when the Kopparberg Bryggeri was formed, pear cider was the first product developed.

Wetherspoon's prime beef steaks come from right here in Ireland, sourced from selected Bord Bia-assured farms (fully traceable from farm to fork), matured for 21 days then seasoned with a steak-seasoning blend.

Since 2017, Foyle Food Group, the local producer with a production site in Omagh, Northern Ireland, has supplied Irish and British beef for UK pubs and Irish breeds only for beef served in the Republic of Ireland.

If steak isn't your thing, customers can choose the BBO chicken melt, as well as lemon & herb char-grilled half chicken or hot and spicy char-grilled half chicken.

Curry Club®

Seven curries are among the choices in Wetherspoon's Curry Club® – available every Thursday 11.30am – 11pm.

All Curry Club® classic curries are served with basmati pilau rice, plain naan bread and poppadums, while the katsu curries are served with mild Japanese-style katsu curry sauce, coconutflavour rice, sliced chillies and coriander.

You can change your plain naan to a garlic naan (for an additional cost), to accompany the classic curry dish of your choice. You can also 'make your curry large' (for an additional cost) by adding a vegetable samosa and an onion bhaji. Side dishes of two onion bhajis and two vegetable samosas, as well as poppadums and dips, are also on the menu.

The Curry Club® classic curry choices are chicken tikka masala, Mangalorean roasted cauliflower & spinach curry, chicken jalfrezi and beef Madras.

Katsu chicken curry, katsu grilled chicken curry and katsu Quorn[™] nugget curry are the three katsu curry choices.

BEER-BREWING DAIRY FARME IS NOT ONE OF THE HERD

Seamus supplies Wetherspoon with cask beer created in converted cow sheds, after diversifying his Monaghan business

etherspoon's pubs across Ireland serve a great range of cask beers, brewed right here in Ireland.

Wetherspoon is proud to support local breweries across Ireland, sourcing locally produced beers for customers to enjoy.

Real-ale enthusiasts at Wetherspoon's pubs can choose from four cask beers from County Monaghan-based Brehon Brewhouse.

Brennan's Barn Blonde Ale (4.3% ABV) is a no-nonsense golden ale with a malty honey-oat body, citrusy hops and a crisp, lightly bitter, spicy finish.

Raglan Road Red Ale (4.5% ABV) is described by many as 'the perfect example of an Irish red'.

The deep, russet-ruby hue of this beer is complemented by its biscuity, aromatic, caramel-malt nutty flavours of toasted hazelnut and crisp tones of hops and berries.

Black Hills Oatmeal Stout (5.0% ABV) has an unmistakeable toasted malt aroma which continues into flavours of dark chocolate, coffee and light detailing of bitter hops.

Full bodied and full of flavour, the use of oatmeal leads to a smooth mouthfeel.

Apollo (6.0% ABV) is a fragrant, yet herbal and woody, India pale ale.

The cloudy orange beer hits so many notes, including tropical fruit, pine cedar and sweet hops, with a slightly bitter finish.

History

Brehon Brewhouse was founded by Seamus McMahon, a dairy farmer with more than 40 years' farming experience, who wanted to diversify his homestead, taking inspiration from the wealth of literary and familial history in the area.

At a time when craft brewing was taking off, Seamus decided to give brewing a go himself, converting sheds for the brewery and employing a master brewer.

The farm has been in the McMahon family for generations (more than 100 years), with visitors to the Brehon Brewery and farm feeling immersed immediately in Irish culture and history.

The name of the brewery itself is inspired by the old Brehon laws which governed medieval Ireland, stating that every clan was allowed to brew beer for its own family.

Microbrewing

Today, all Brehon Brewhouse beer is brewed on site at a state-ofthe-art microbrewing facility, which has grown in a short space of time to become a 30HL plant.

A deep on-site borewell provides all of the water required for the brewing process, with all ingredients sourced from the local farming community and the grains traceable to source.

Seamus said: "We're absolutely delighted to be supplying to Wetherspoon. The pubs are a perfect fit for our ales.

We also know, with Wetherspoon's experience with real ale, that our beers are looked after and served well."

Espresso Martini

Premium vodka is paired with 100% Brazilian Arabica coffee and gently sweetened with coffee liqueur, then garnished with coffee beans.

In Cuba affectionately known as Daiquiri de fresa, this is white rum, combined with pressed lime, sugar, strawberry liqueur and strawberry purée, then garnished with strawberry.

Tommy's Margarita

Pressed lime juice is sweetened with organic agave syrup and shaken with blanco tequila, then garnished with lime.

Keavan's Port Hotel (Dublin)

Wetherspoon's newest and biggest hotel in the Republic of Ireland is Keavan's Port Hotel, set in Dublin's village quarter.

Opened in 2021, in Camden Street Upper and Lower, in Dublin's city centre, the pub and hotel development is, at €33 million, the single-largest investment made by Wetherspoon in its 44-year history.

Wetherspoon developed a series of eight Georgian townhouses (seven of which are protected) and a chapel, then added a substantial modern extension featuring a 12-metre-high glazed atrium.

Keavan's Port Hotel has 89 en suite rooms. including accessible rooms, complete with full DDA-compliant wet room bathroom facilities, designed for guests with disabilities.

Each room features tea- and coffee-making facilities, hair-dryer, flat-screen television with Saorview Freesat TV, unlimited free Wi-Fi and digital air-conditioning.

Located on rejuvenated Camden Street with plenty of bars and restaurants to choose from, including Wetherspoon's pub called Keavan's Port, the hotel is just over half a mile from the city centre and Grafton Street.

Keavan's Port is located a short distance from many of Dublin's attractions.



The Old Borough (Swords)

Wetherspoon's first hotel outside of the UK was opened in August 2018, in the Republic of Ireland.

Located just eight miles north of Dublin city centre and just a 10-minute drive from Dublin Airport, the hotel at The Old Borough (Swords) has been extending a warm Wetherspoon welcome for five years.

The building is one of Sword's best known, designed by noted Irish architect Francis Johnston.

A school opened on the site in 1809 and continued to run for 191 years, until its closure in 2000.

The building's interior has been altered over the years, but the outside is much as it was when designed by Johnston, more than 200 years ago.

Historic Swords dates from AD 560 and sits on Ward River.

The bustling shopping town is close to Dublin Airport, with fast, frequent transport links (Dublin Bus and Swords Express services run from outside the hotel) to and from Dublin Airport and the city centre.
