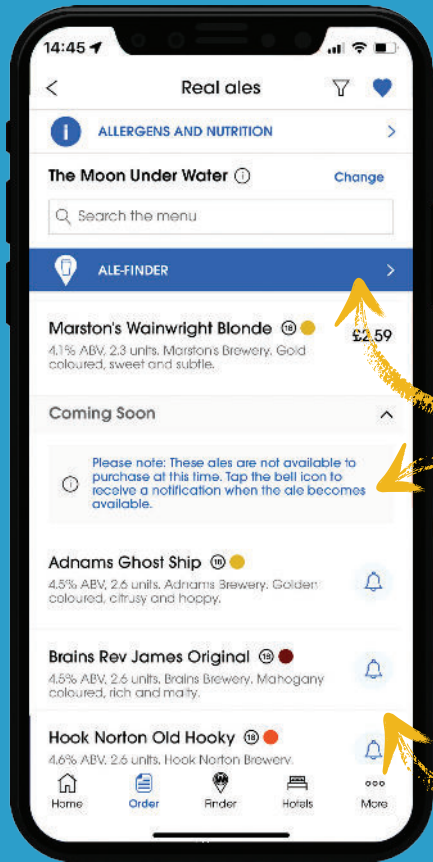

Pints

Cairngorm Lairig Brew 4.0% ABV

Cairngorm Brewery, Aviemore, Highlands. Est. 1997

This copper-coloured beer is a classic Scottish bitter, with its delicate malt flavour and hints of caramel balanced by pleasing hop notes and a fruity finish.

Hops: Challenger, Fuggles



Loch Lomond Sail Away 4.0% ABV

Loch Lomond Brewery, Dumbarton, West Dunbartonshire. Est. 2011

This light golden beer is brewed using a single-variety British hop, delivering floral notes and tropical fruit flavours, balanced by a biscuity backbone.

Hops: Olicana



MòR Blue Gold 4.0% ABV

MÒR Beers, Kellas, Angus. Est. 2012

This new golden ale contains Scottish-grown spirulina, creating a natural blue colour. It is packed full of blueberry flavours, complemented by fruity hop notes.

Hops: Mosaic



Swannay Dark Munroe 4.0% ABV

Swannay Brewery, Swannay, Orkney. Est. 2006

This ruby beer has roast malt and coffee notes on the nose, leading to notes of vanilla, chocolate and hops on the palate, along with a refreshing, clean finish.

Hops: Goldings



Harviestoun Ochil Vienna 4.1% ABV

Harviestoun Brewery, Alva, Clackmannanshire. Est. 1983

This copper-coloured cask lager has floral and citrus aromas, leading to a malty, slightly sweet flavour, with caramel and toffee notes, plus a clean finish.

Hops: Cascade, Challenger, Magnum, Saaz, Tettnang



Orkney Boulder Beach 4.4% ABV

Orkney Brewery, Quoyloo, Orkney. Est. 1988

Named after a beach in Hoy, Orkney, this golden APA delivers herbal and lemon citrus flavours, leading to a surprisingly bold, punchy hop finish for such a smooth beer.

Hops: Columbus



Fyne Ales Heather Brae 4.5% ABV

Fyne Ales, Cairndow, Argyll. Est. 2001

This amber 80/- beer has a malty, slightly sweet aroma, with a malty biscuit and earthy hop character, delivering a warming finish.

Hops: East Kent Goldings



Stewart Beekeeper's Gold 4.8% ABV

Stewart Brewing, Loanhead, Midlothian. Est. 2004

This golden beer has an initial delicate honey sweetness, followed by subtle hop notes, soft malt and a touch of toffee, resulting in a crisp finish.

Hops: Cascade, Magnum, Mandarin Bavaria



Williams March of the Penguins 4.9% ABV

Williams Bros Brewing, Alloa, Clackmannanshire. Est. 1993

This black stout has aromas of roast malt, coffee, liquorice and orange peel, leading to a smooth, rich, malty flavour – with fresh hop notes.

Hops: Cascade, Magnum



Pints

Fierce Oak-Aged Amber 5.0% ABV

Fierce Beer, Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire. Est. 2016

This smooth, malty copper ale has notes of caramel, toasted biscuit and light toffee, leading to an oaky character, balanced by a clean finish.

Hops: Aurora



Broughton Old Jock Champion Double Ale 5.4% ABV

Broughton Ales, Broughton, Tweeddale. Est. 1979

This dark ruby beer is a delicate blend of stout and Scotch ale, resulting in a rich, roasted character with a warm, malty finish.

Hops: First Gold, Fuggles, Perle



Skye Blonde 5.5% ABV

Isle of Skye Brewing, Uig, Isle of Skye. Est. 1995

This smooth, golden beer delivers gentle biscuit notes and light malt sweetness, balanced by a subtle citrus lift and a moderate hop character.

Hops: Centennial, Saaz

Fierce Iron Brew 4.5% ABV 440ml

Fierce Beer, Aberdeenshire. Est. 2016

This brilliant orange beer is light and refreshing in character, with a distinctive flavour and a sweet, yet crisp, finish.

Hops: Summit



Loch Lomond Zoom Time 4.5% ABV 440ml

Loch Lomond Brewery, West Dunbartonshire. Est. 2011

This hazy orange, light and refreshing New England IPA has aromas of stone fruit and pineapple, leading to a citrus fruit explosion and a juicy, sweet finish.

Hops: Amarillo, Galaxy, Mosaic



Fierce IPA 5.0% ABV 440ml

Fierce Beer, Aberdeenshire. Est. 2016

This bright golden beer has a sweet, juicy aroma of fruit and caramel, leading to bittersweet citrus zest flavours and a crisp, refreshing finish.

Hops: Citra, Mosaic



Stewart New Relic 5.6% ABV 440ml

Stewart Brewing, Midlothian. Est. 2004

This straw-coloured slightly hazy IPA is full of beautiful stone fruit and blueberry notes, resulting in a full-flavoured character, with a lasting finish.

Hops: Mosaic



Loch Lomond Bravehop 6.0% ABV 440ml

Loch Lomond Brewery, West Dunbartonshire. Est. 2011

This amber west coast IPA has a predominant citrus flavour, complemented by pine and resin notes, leading to a lasting, bittersweet finish.

Hops: Centennial, Chinook, Columbus



REAL-ALE AND CRAFT TYPES

The colour of the pint or the dot after each craft beer's name is the closest match to the colour of the beer.
